- 9. All hard copy materials must be postmarked or electronic materials sent to the NIAAA State Liaison in your respective state by your states deadline. Select your state at the bottom of the website Scholarship Page to view your states deadline and liaison information.

Scholarship Awards:

State Winners - The Connecticut Association of Athletic Directors will honor (3) males and (3) females. One male and one female will receive \$1000 and a plaque recognizing them as the state winners. The other finalists will receive \$500 and a certificate.

NIAAA Section Winners - one male and one female will each receive a \$1,500 scholarship and a plaque recognizing them as section winners.
